  - Shortlisted submissions selected for online voting will be required to submit a two-minute 'elevator pitch' video outlining their innovation, to be posted on the event platform.
  - The delegate must comply with all program requirements (e.g., AV needs, pitch duration, presentation format, etc.).
- The SPC reserves the right to determine the presentation format and may limit the number of presentations per presenter.
- The intention of FMIF is to showcase the latest innovations and best practices transforming primary health care and improving patient care. This is a public-facing event. The responsibility for **protecting sensitive or proprietary information** rests with the innovator and attendees.
- All submitters will be notified of their submission status by mid-July.
